1. What did Kit and Sam tell Jay he could not have for dinner?

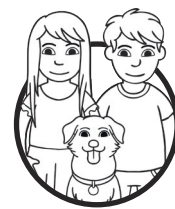
2. In the classroom, Jay stays hidden. Can you explain this?

3. Jay could not stay. Pick the right ending: He had to go...

A. ...as he had not had fun.	B. ...as he had to go back to his planet.	C. ...as Kit and Sam said he should go.
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Can you explain your answer to the person sitting next to you?



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Adult Guidance

Please find below the reading comprehension questions and some handy talking points for your class after the children have read the minibook. These are designed to be adult-led and encourage discussion either one-to-one, in a small group or with the whole class.

1. What did Kit and Sam tell Jay he could not have for dinner?

Answer: A toad.

Follow-up questions:

- Do you think Jay wanted a toad for dinner?
- What other kinds of food do you think he enjoys?
- Is there anything similar to toads that people on Earth eat?
- What would be your favourite thing for dinner?

2. In the classroom, Jay stays hidden. Can you explain this?

Answers might include: To stay safe. Other people don't know about him. It might surprise people to see an alien at school. He might be shy.

Discussion points:

- If you went to a school on another planet, how do you think you might feel?
- Do you think you would want to stay hidden like Jay?
- How would the school children on another planet feel about you?

3. Jay could not stay. Pick the right ending: He had to go...

Answer: B ...as he had to go back to his planet.

Discussion points:

- Why do you think he had to go back to his planet?
- Where do you think Jay is from?
- How would he get home?
- Had Jay had a good time with Kit and Sam?
